Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented.

Ways and Means: Building rental income for the month of March was \$395. April projected to be approximately \$280.

The March rummage sale went very well. Over 130 people attended Souper Starz in March and over \$3,000 was raised for non-profit organizations in our community.
