





Member Spotlight

Sheila Kenny

Family members: I am the oldest of four children. Three girls and 1 boy. Born into an Irish Catholic Family in 1950.

Where did you grow up: I was born in Los Angeles, CA at the Queen of Angels Hospital in downtown Los Angeles. That hospital was founded in 1926 by the Franciscan Sisters of the Sacred Heart and closed in 1989. The building was then used as a movie set by the local film industry and then bought by the Assembly of God church. It still exists today and is now known as the Dream Center addressing homelessness, hunger and addiction.

I grew up in North Hollywood CA, a new suburb of Los Angeles. My Grandfather was a Banker and Real Estate Developer and built and sold all of the houses on our street, about 20 homes. Every time he came to visit, he would take the time to go to each home and talk with all of the homeowners. I attended St. Patrick's catholic school and church about a 4 block walk from home.

Past Work/Past Highlights: My family moved to Maryland in 1968 (my father worked for the Federal Government) and I got a job at the Library of Congress where I microfilmed old newspapers. I remember reading actual coverage in one of the U.S. papers of the Lindburgh flight. And then, I was a back- office tech in ophthalmology/optometry for most of my working days.

Hobbies: My current hobbies are line dancing and Mahjongg. In the past, I was an avid tennis player and then more recently, pickleball. AND, I just started taking piano lessons having never played an instrument before.

Something we may not know about you: I took a motorcycle riding class at age 60. I was the oldest in the class and NEVER thought that I would pass. Owned 3 different motorcycles and joined a CA women's motorcycle group. Never give up. Also, I attended the Woodstock Music Festival in 1969. (Maryland, remember?)

Current Involvement in the Senior Center: I teach and participate in line dance classes and play Mahjongg.

What do you like most about the Senior Center: I love seeing all of the people at the center. Smiling faces. A big family of friendship. Hugs to all.
